

What is an Individual Curriculum Plan?

An Individual Curriculum Plan (ICP) is used to record curriculum decisions for students who are being provided a curriculum at a higher or lower level than their age cohort for one or more subjects

How have you determined my child needs an ICP?

Students who are achieving below or above their age cohort have been identified through analysis of data including work samples, assessment tasks and diagnostic tests. The classroom teacher and Head of Inclusive Education work together on this process.

Why would an ICP be of benefit to my child?

For a student to achieve success with their education, it is important the curriculum they are provided is at a level most suited to the individual student. An ICP ensures that students have the opportunity to achieve to their full potential.

How will this change my child's education?

When an ICP is implemented to support a student's education, this allows the teacher to provide a curriculum at a higher or lower level, assess the student's progress and also report on their achievement at the level determined in the ICP.

Will this be a permanent change in my child's education?

ICPs are created and implemented for a semester and then reviewed. When an ICP is reviewed, it may be determined that the document requires changes or the student no longer requires an ICP.
